Community Facility Enhancement Program (CFEP)

CFEP is a matching grant program. It provides financial assistance to build, purchase, repair, renovate, upgrade or otherwise improve sports, recreational, cultural or other related family and community wellness facilities. The maximum level of funding for any one facility is \$125,000 per fiscal year.

Community Initiatives Program (CIP)

CIP funding is approved on a matching grant basis. It supports project based initiatives in areas such as community services, seniors' services, libraries, arts and culture, sports, education, health and recreation. The maximum grant level will be \$75,000 per project per year.

The purpose of the Canadian Sport for Life Project Grant is to support implementation of the Canadian Sport for Life and Long Term Athlete Development (LTAD) framework. Grants are available for the development and application of the principles of the first four stages of the LTAD framework into program design, development and delivery.

The new Coach and Official Development Initiatives provide opportunities to further coaching and officiating development in Alberta.

The Above and Beyond grant provides support to coaches and officials to pursue educational or developmental opportunities. Specifically, this is intended for a coach or an official that is in a unique situation (apprenticing, geographically isolated, disadvantaged) and that are experiencing extraordinary circumstances.

The Visitation grant provides support to Provincial Sport Associations and their clubs to offset travel and accommodation costs to host an out of province or out of country coach or official.
